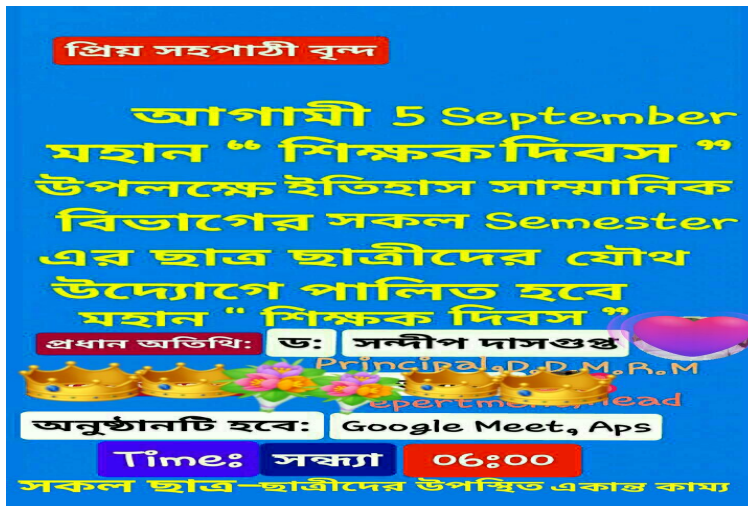


Teachers' Day Celebrations by the Department of History on 05/09/2022
