#### Definition of ragging:

- Targeting a student on the ground of his colour, race, religion, caste, gender, sexual orientation, linguistic identity or economic background.
- Deliberately creating a sense of shame or embarrassing a junior student or fresher.
- Force students to perform acts which can lead to physical injury/ mental torture or death

#### Objectives of Anti Ragging Committee:

- a) To prevent the students to indulge in harmful act of ragging
- b) To raise an awareness among the students about the harm of ragging on mind and body of a person
- c) To maintain a sustained effort to control any act of ragging.

#### Formation and Composition of the Committee:

The Anti Ragging Committee comprised of faculty members, administrative staff, representatives from student body, representative from local body, Parents Representatives and others. The members were selected based on their commitment to promote a ragging-free environment and their ability to handle sensitive issues effectively.
