The webinar titled "*Care for Mouthful of Sky: Reason and Empathy of 'Care'*" was held on 17th



August, 2020, and hosted by Dum Dum Motijheel Rabindra Mahavidyalaya. The speaker was Dr. sanjukta Basu from Rabindra Bharati University, She is an Associate Professor from the Department of Philosophy. The webinar featured interactive Q&A sessions, allowing participants to pose questions and share their perspectives. Breakout sessions facilitated deeper discussions on specific aspects of care, fostering a collaborative learning environment. The session brought together experts from various fields to discuss the multifaceted concept of 'care' through the lenses of reason

and empathy. The event was attended by eighty to hundred participants, including professionals, academics, and students, who engaged in a thought-provoking discussion on the significance and implementation of care in different contexts. The webinar underscored the necessity of integrating reason and empathy in caregiving practices. While reason provides a structured approach to problem-solving, empathy ensures that care is personalized and humane.



Participants discussed common challenges faced by caregivers, including emotional burnout, lack of resources, and societal undervaluation of care work. The need for better support systems and recognition of caregivers was emphasized. Several innovative care models were highlighted, showcasing successful implementations of empathetic and reasoned care. Examples included community-based care programs and technology-assisted caregiving solutions. "*Care For Mouthful of Sky: Reason and Empathy of 'Care'*" provided valuable insights into the complex nature of care. The discussions illuminated the necessity of combining rational planning with empathetic understanding to enhance caregiving practices. Participants left with a greater appreciation of the ethical, psychological, sociocultural, and policy-related dimensions of care, equipped with practical knowledge to apply in their respective fields.
